II. Remember: Looking Back on God's Faithfulness (Josh. 24:2-13)

- A. God Initiated Redemption: Abraham (Josh 24:2-3)
 - 1. Who did Abraham's family serve initially?
 - 2. What makes the difference for Abraham (v. 3)?
 - 3. The doctrine of regeneration, by God's grace alone, is a great stumbling block to the prideful human heart
 - 4. God continues his work and on his timetable.
- B. God's Inscrutable Wisdom in Redemption: Esau and Jacob (Josh. 24:4)
 - 1. The experience of the redeemed is not always a straight line (cf. Esau and Jacob's experience)
- C. God's Power in Redemption: Egypt, Wilderness, Enemies (Josh. 24:5-13)
 - 1. Note the subject of all the action verbs. Who is doing the acting/work/fighting?
 - 2. God defeats a great nation: God vs. Egypt (Josh. 24:5-7a)

 - 4. God fought for them in the land (Josh. 24:11-13)
